

A WALK TO REMEMBER

CAXTON STREET, SUNCORP AND THE HEART OF Rugby League

Excited masses descend from Roma Street Station, decked out in all of their team's regalia, fuelled by the energy that funnels them towards their final destination: Suncorp Stadium.

The walk down Caxton Street is a well-worn path for footy fans, one that builds anticipation for the gladiatorial battle ahead.

A trip down the iconic stretch of road can be an exhilarating adventure, no matter which team you support.

Come State of Origin time, if you wear anything blue; you may find yourself fending off a few well-directed "cockroach" barbs, while donning the bloodhued shades of maroon will have you making new friends keen to shout you a beer.

"The running of the buses" – now deemed unsafe due to the level of passion it invokes from fans – was once a rite of passage and nothing would make a player feel more alive than the Blues' bus trip down Caxton Street before an Origin match, with the strip heaving with bodies eager to either exalt or intimidate the players inside, depending on the colours they wore.

While things are arguably more civil these days, there is still plenty of atmosphere on a game night.



Queenslanders may no longer approach the Blues bus in the way they once did, but that doesn't mean they aren't still approaching their football with their fair share of good-natured banter – usually with a round of their favourite cold beverage firmly in hand.

Heading down to the stadium from the top of the street takes in many sights and conjures a rich history of Rugby League support and celebration.

Pass the Lord Alfred Hotel and the Caxton Street Pub and you'll find yourself at the NRL-owned Gambaro Hotel, with the Seafood Restaurant and MG Bar the latest place to dine and drink for all rugby league lovers. Continuing on as you wander past the wooden houses that still evoke images of an old Lang Park and the memory of the 'Frank Burge Stand', the trek down Caxton Street is like a journey through the heart and history of Brisbane itself.

It's the small strip of bitumen that has become a microcosm of the city, and of Queensland – a place that is vibrant, boisterous, cheeky and, most of all, ready to have some fun.

Murray's Magical Try Assist

Magic Round in 2022 was the scene of arguably the most miraculous try assist witnessed in the modern game. With all but his ankles suspended in mid-air and over the sideline – and a defender driving the rest of him out of bounds at a rapid rate – Cowboys winger Murray Taulagi contorted his body and unleashed a logic-defying offload for teammate Scott Drinkwater to score. The try went on to be judged the NRL's Drinkwise Try of the Year.

Ponga's Dazzling Solo Effort

With the Knights' 2019 clash against the Bulldogs hanging in the balance, Kalyn Ponga produced some of his trademark footwork to bamboozle the defensive line and score a brilliant individual try. A goose step which transitioned into a powerful right-foot bounce left Kieran Foran clutching at thin air, and from there KP was too fast for any of the covering defenders, scoring a try which sent Suncorp Stadium into a frenzy.

RE-LIVING FOUR MOMENTS OF MAGIC

Every year, NRL Magic Round Brisbane delivers its share of truly magical moments. We take a look back at some of the biggest plays and games from previous years at Suncorp Stadium.



Wests Tigers Roaring Start

Almost everything the Wests Tigers touched in the first 20 minutes of their 2019 clash with the Panthers turned to gold, as they ran in five tries in 17 minutes to set up a dominant 30-4 victory. Long-range tries to Moses Mbye and Luke Brooks were scored a minute apart, followed by strikes to Esan Marsters, Corey Thompson and Robert Jennings. It was sweet revenge for the Wests Tigers in their first game against former coach Ivan Cleary.



Raiders Defy The Odds To End Slump

Trailing 12-8 and staring down the barrel of their sixth-straight loss, things were looking grim for Canberra when prop Josh Papali'i was sent from the field for a high tackle on Bulldogs winger Tuipulotu Katoa with 20 minutes to go in their 2021 clash. But what followed was a gutsy comeback from the 12-man Raiders, who scored two tries of their own and scrambled to hold the Bulldogs to a sole four-pointer – earning them a 20-18 victory.
